# Best Maintained Government & Government Aided School Award

"Award is a testament to the commitment and tribute to dynamism"

We at TCF firmly believe that, award validates and encourages the qualitative and quantitative development of a project. Keeping in view of this factor, we encourage our project beneficiaries through various positive reinforcements.

One such initiative in collaboration with the RI Dist 3230 especially the Rotary Centenary Charitable Trust is the "Best Maintained Gov/Aided School award" among the renovated schools under 'Schools into smiles' project. This award program enables the schools to perform well in the areas of basic needs, academics, health and hygiene, infrastructure and other extracurricular activities of the school. This program will be conducted once in 2 years.

Last year, this award program was extended to 130 Govt. and Panchayat schools. They submitted their quarterly reports about various activities and initiatives, which they had undertaken to maintain the school. The schools were also instructed to send their project proposals about the effective utilization of the Prize money if they were to be short listed. Based on the reports and field evaluations done by our panel, the winners were short listed. 3 schools received awards during the 'Schools into Smiles' Cultural Fest 2013 and the details are as follows,

#### 1st Prize


Name: Rotary Ramu Reddiar School, Thiruvanamalai

Prize money: ₹. 50,000/-

Positive points: Campus always looks clean and tidy; they have planted more than 100 trees, Regular Physical Education Trainings have been conducted.

Utilization of the Prize money: For electrical works in the new block, constructed through MMRT-42 and also to purchase sports equipments.






#### 2<sup>nd</sup> Prize

Name: Villivakkam Panchayat Union Middle School, Sector-2

Prize money: ₹. 30,000/-

*Positive points:* Selected by British Council to do the education exchange project with Foreign. Dist. Award winner for making Human Pyramid.

*Utilization of the Prize money:* Purchased two steel almirahs, one Table and indoor sports items.







#### 3rd Prize

Name: Minjur Panchyat Union Primary School, Sembasipallikuppam

Prize money: ₹. 20,000/-

*Positive points:* The children were clean and tidy. They participated & won prizes in various contests at the District level.

Utilization of the Prize money: Purchased a PA system for School





## Scholarship

The Cherian Foundation also provides educational support to deserving children, with exceptional academic records. Mark lists were collected from our target group during the month of June. Totally, 13 children received prize money and gifts based on the level of their grades.



# Scholarship for College Fees

TCF has been supporting the education of Ms. Pachayammal since 10th std. At present she is doing her final year of college in SIET, Chennai. As a part of the continuous supportive education program, we extended our hands with a Scholarship amount of 3.3,000-to pay for her final year college fees.

# Water Storage Tank for the Rotary Model School, Mugappair

In collaboration with our primary partner RI Dist 3230 Rotary Centenary Charitable Trust, we have adopted the maintenance of 2 schools in Chennai. One among these is the Rotary model school, at Mugappair.

On a visit, we found that the overhead water tank at the school had caused severe seepage and had damaged the structure housing 4 classrooms which were extremely dangerous. This year, the same was renovated and a new water tank was installed with a capacity of 1000 liters of water storage. Nearly 165 students benefitted through this.





# Literacy Class at Alinjivakkam

TCF in collaboration with Raj Hair International, Alinjivakkam have taken up the task of making the workforce a 100% literate. It is an ongoing program started in the year 2012. This year, 20 Candidates from Alinjivakkam village enrolled in the literacy program. Only those who have not had any formal education were selected. Their course involves learning to identify numbers,

reading and writing basic Tamil words based on a literacy guideline. The classes are conducted for half an hour, once a week for 52 weeks. TCF is very thankful to Raj Hair International for providing a platform to execute our activities and thereby reaching our objectives.





#### **Evaluation**

To evaluate the progress level of the program, Director conducted literacy tests, once in 4 months and the progress was documented.

# **Cleaning of Premises at Social Service** League School

At TCF health support is a key objective and we encourage the poorer communities to keep their environment clean and healthy. Last year, we undertook the premise cleaning of Social Service League School by removing waste, weeds and overgrown bushes to make the compound healthy, safe and accessible for the children to play, which is in line with "Swachh Bharat Abhiyan", A National level campaign by the Government of India, the biggest ever cleanliness drive initiated by Prime Minister Narendra Modi. We are proud of our contribution.





# Inverter for Primary Health Centre

Primary Health Centre (PHC) is considered as one of the key establishments by the Govt. in providing health care to the public. Considering this, we have identified the PHC at Panchetty, to be one of our long term projects for its modernization. This centre caters to the medical needs of residents of Panchetty and surrounding 10 neighboring villages. The initiatives are as follows,

Phase I: It is a notable fact that, in collaboration with Raj Hair International, we have already provided a shed in the Out Patient section of the PHC last year, benefitting nearly 30 patients every day as expressed by the Health Inspector.

Phase II: In continuation with phase -I, this year we have done a detailed survey on the needs of PHC. As expressed by the Medical Practitioner on duty, It was discovered that the PHC was facing numerous problems due to power cut lasting for 3-4 hours every day. The condition was so dire that they were using emergency lights while attending to the delivery



cases. Understanding the urgency of the requirement, we donated a 1.8 KVA Inverter at the cost of Rs. 50, 000 to the health centre. This inverter now powers the Labour Ward, New Born Corner and Post Natal Ward.

Given below are the requirements for the PHC to function effectively (as appealed by the authorities of the PHC),

- Incubator (2 nos)
- Ultrasound Scanner machine
- Mini RO Plant
- Solar Power
- Steel chair with multiple seater
- Compound wall to be build (₹.800/running sq.ft.)
- Painting work for full building (₹.10/running sq.ft.)
- Plantation of Neem tree (17 nos) + tree guard (17 nos)

This PHC is considered as the primary resource that caters to the medical needs of the people, whose livelihood is dependent on the factories of Panchetty, Alinjivakkam. Thus, as a community driven approach, TCF has sent proposals to the nearby 10 factories to raise funds for the modernization of the PHC.

TCF will be very thankful to the readers of this newsletter if, you extend any form of support for this noble cause and your contributions will be acknowledged.



# **Distribution of Spectacles**

TCF in collaboration with Raj Holdings conducted an eye camp on

3rd October 2013 at Mugappair. We purchased 50 spectacles for ₹.20,700/for free distribution. During the camp 33 people were identified to be in need of spectacles.

#### Referral services

Followed by the eye camp, 8 referral cases from Alinjivakkam and 10 from Mugappair were brought to Rajan Eye Care Hospital, Velachery branch on 24th, 25th, 26th, 28th February & 3rd March 2014. 17 out of the 18 cases were prescribed to wear Spectacles respectively.


#### **Jumble Sales**


# Plantation of Tree sapling
